
- To critically engage you to think about the racial and cultural inclusivity of the role play spaces in your Early Years provision.


## 5 STOP CENTERING WHITENESS, IT'S NOT THE DEFAULT





When we are re-enacting 'Goldilocks and the 3 Bears' for instance or 'Frozen' think critically abut how hair, white skin and femininity is framed.
